On Thursday, November 28thnd BFO Durham Region held its annual Angels' Tree of Light ceremony at the Durham District School Board. A large crowd were in attendance. This year, the angel chosen featured a white angel silhouette. The tree looked so beautiful, adorned with over 600 angels and white lights. Each angel had the name of a loved one handwritten on gold ribbon. Each one represented a loved one sadly missed by their families and friends throughout the year but especially now during the holiday season.

Jane Carter (Executive Director, BFO Durham) welcomed everyone to the ceremony with soothing words as this can be a difficult time, especially for those experiencing a loss for the first time. She was ably assisted by Gary Goswell (Chair, Board of Directors, BFO Durham).

Opening Remarks were given by Rev. Maureen McLellan. Her gentle words gave advice, encouragement and support to the audience. She shared experiences of loss and spoke with empathy.

This year, the tree was dedicated by Wayne Wanamaker in memory of his son, David Wanamaker. Wayne spoke eloquently about his grief journey following the loss of David. He spoke of his first Christmas without his son and of the comfort gained from the tremendous feeling of love when he attended his first Angels" Tree ceremony. He encouraged us all to seek out the positives in the darkest of our experiences.

Nicole and Tony Cacciatore along with their children, Max, Elio and Giorgia had the honour of lighting our tree this year, in memory of their son and brother, Antonio.

As the lights in the auditorium dimmed, only the tree shone out in the darkness. There was a moment of silence for reflection.

Following the reflection, there was a musical tribute to the "angels".

Linda Daniluk performed, "Live On", followed by a performance of "Rainbow" by Lauren Rohrbach. Both songs were sung in memory of Andrew and Rebecca Sears and David Sears.

Both performances were very moving and received much deserved applause from the audience.

Finally, the ceremony concluded with the Responsive Reading led by Nancy Raby and Sharon Sears in memory of their children, Melissa Raby and Andrew and Rebecca Sears.

This retreat is a joint undertaking of BFO – Durham and the Villa St. Joseph, Cobourg.


Now in its 21st year, the weekend is facilitated by Susan Hendricks and Joyce MacIntyre, bereaved mothers with special training and education in psychology and group process. The theme is different each year.

Susan and Joyce met each other in 1992 when they attended a BFO support group in Toronto following the death of their children, Kristina and Duane. Since then, their friendship has embraced a shared vocation where they companion other bereaved mothers toward a place of peace and understanding. Though she moved to Manitoba eleven years ago, Susan remains a lay associate of the Peterborough Neighbourhood of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Canada and is a co-founder of BFO -Durham. Joyce, who fought to regain her Native status, is a published poet and artist who offers her special talents back to both her Native and bereavement communities. Joyce resides in Stouffville, ON.

a weekend retreat co-sponsored by BFO – Durham Region & Villa St. Joseph



"We live within the circle, the circle of life and the circle of death. We move within the memory of the past while moving toward the future. We bathe in the light of the rising Sun and dream by the light of Grandmother Moon. We learn, we laugh, we celebrate, we mourn. We stand in the center. Above and below to the right of us, to the left of us, in front of us and behind us, we remember, we connect, and we let go of what holds us back. Everything that the world does is done in a circle."

OUR THEME: STUGS and WINKS?

Grief is a mystery unto itself– not something to avoid or to understand – but to go within, to evolve through and with. So much of our process in the early days of grief is simply learning to function again, to carry on despite our loss and pain. At some point, we learn to cope and that life continues but will never be the same.

Yet on certain days when all is seemingly going well, we may be suddenly overwhelmed by a STUG moment (Sudden Temporary Upsurge of Grief) and are catapulted back to those overwhelming feelings of grief that marked our early days as bereaved mothers. At others, there is a WINK, one of those coincidences or signs that our loved one is with us and we are united again in that eternal connection with our child and the mystery of the universe.

The secret life of the bereaved mother is the journey of coming to know that STUGS and WINKS are not two separate experiences, but one.

RETREAT DETAILS

This weekend of ritual, candle lighting in memory of our children, meditation, workshops and group discussion sessions focuses on our personal, psychological and spiritual growth.

Enhanced by the peace and quiet of the Villa St. Joseph and its welcoming Sisters, this is a weekend where all may enter the quiet and holy space within our awareness of how the loss of our children has impacted our lives as women and mothers, and reconnect with the Seed of Life that rests in all of Creation. A retreat requires some quiet introspection as we ponder and welcome in the presence of our Angels within what seems to have become an empty world. We learn more about ourselves and the grief process by sharing with others. The shared meals, music and laughter also create a sense of community that often continues long after the retreat is over.

The Bereaved Mothers' Retreat weekend is part of BFO's aftercare programming for those who have already completed a support group. Because of the possible intensity of a weekend retreat experience, it is advised that participants be *at least* three years into the bereavement process. Running from Friday evening at 7 pm until just after lunch on Sunday, the retreat is designed to deepen psychological, spiritual and personal understanding of how our child's death may have an ongoing impact on our lives

What do I bring with me?

- Bring comfortable shoes or slippers, warm, casual clothing, personal toilet articles, soap, etc.
- Bedding and towels are provided.
 For the ultimate spa experience, bring your own bath sized towel.
- A framed photo of your child to be displayed during our prayer services
- A journal and pen if you are a note-taker
- A small contribution to our communal snack table for the Saturday Evening Gathering in the Lounge

The Retreat Centre is a smoke and water bottle free environment. Also, please avoid perfumes.

ANGELS TREE OF LIGHT DEDICATION

November 28, 2019

Hello and welcome. Like most everyone in this room I too have an angel on this beautiful tree before us. My son David. David was 24 and the youngest of my 3 children. Sept 25, 2012 It was sudden and unexpected. David and I had what I liked to call an oil and water relationship. I would give him my words of advice based on my life experiences and he would call me a bubble burster. I think it was because we were so much alike that we were this way.

David was diagnosed with Addison's disease, the failure of the Adrenal Gland when he was 19. He was on various meds to control the chemical balances in his system. We were never told that he could pass from this, but he did. What made it even harder to deal with was that David passed 4 days before his sister's wedding. We had the funeral on Friday and went right into the wedding rehearsal Friday evening. I still don't know how we did it but we did. We had to. We had the wedding on Saturday and it was a beautiful day. It wasn't easy but we did it.

I honestly don't remember much about that first Christmas without David. I liken it to wandering through a fog. I do know that I took a picture of David with me to my sister's. I wanted him to be part of the family gathering in any way possible. I don't think the rest of my family understood what I was trying to do but that's ok. I don't expect anyone to understand what we go through unless you too have lost a child.

I attended my first BFO Angel Tree the following November and all I remember is the huge amount of love and emotion that was in this room. I truly didn't feel alone in my grief. There is just something so comforting about being with friends that truly understand, members of the club that no one wants to belong to.

Grief is the last act of love we must give to those we loved. Where there is deep grief, there is great love.

I was speaking with a therapist shortly after losing David and she described to me that my grief was like a boulder, sitting on my back and shoulders, making it hard for me to move, to breathe, to function. She explained to me that as I moved forward with my grief, there was no telling how long this would take, the boulder will get smaller, until it is small enough to hold in my hand and place in my pocket. I can take it out, hold it in my hand, think of David, shed a tear or two, maybe even a smile. Then I can put it back in my pocket and carry on with my day. This is my David stone that I have carried with me every day for 7 years now. There are some days that I can't take my hand off my David stone. Most days I can take my hand in and out of my pocket, feel my David stone and even smile at its unwavering presence. I've accepted this stone as my own, crossing my hands over it, saying "mine" as children do.

I cry for the life you lived and the one you didn't

As easy as it is to find the negatives in what I have gone through, I found a positive through all of this. About 6 months before David passed, he was so tired of being sick and not getting any better that I felt he had given up. David lived in Niagara with his mother and I lived here in Oshawa. I started going to Niagara one night a week to spend time with David. I did this every week for 6 months. We would go out for a burger, a couple of beers, maybe shoot some pool or see a movie or just hang out. I truly believe that he enjoyed these times as much as I did. What it taught me is to not put off spending time with someone you care about. You might not get another chance. I have no regrets. I've shared this story with others, and it made them stop and think about their own children and family. That alone gives me comfort.

My friend and brother from another mother Stevie wrote a song in the year after David died called David's Song. In it he and I are sitting in Harry's Hideaway talking about old friends, fast cars and the girls that got away. Why he left and I decided to stay. He spoke of how my life had been consumed by the death of my son David. He talked of another David who walked through the shadow of the valley of death and that I must honour my David and walk with the living. That is what David would want, time spent with family. There's a powerful message in this song and a positive message too.

As we approach the Christmas season take the time to spend with family and friends and enjoy that time. And most of all take time to remember those not with us for they are with us in our hearts. I am honoured on behalf of all here tonight to dedicate these angels to the loving memory of those we miss so dearly at this time of year. Thank you.
