The Ride to Remember in support of Bereaved Families of Ontario – Durham was fortunate to have another beautiful day to ride the north Durham countryside and raise \$18,000 as well as promote awareness for such a worthy cause. This year's contribution takes the total donation since inception of the Ride to almost \$105,000!

To begin the day we gathered at Canadian Tire in Uxbridge to sign in and enjoy refreshments supplied by Tim Horton's. We were pleased to have the participation of Uxbridge Fire Department as well as Durham Regional Police to control intersections as the ride got underway. With a longer route planned this year, we headed to our first stop at Mainstreet Landing in Buckhorn for lunch, as the parade of orange t-shirts brought a visual presence to our cause. Our lunch stop was a relaxing setting as we overlooked the boats going in and out of the Buckhorn Lock on the Trent system. An outdoor patio with live entertainment gave riders a chance to mingle and catch up with so many people who have been participating year after year. Along with the returning riders, we always have some new people joining us and quite often with a reason to be involved. After lunch we enjoyed a scenic route back to Foxbridge Golf Course in Uxbridge. Food, entertainment and a chance to bid on some great silent auction items completed the day. Somehow we rode the waves of grief and found ourselves ashore again.

As these waves subside new ones will build as we head into the holidays that speak of, and to, children. Halloween will soon approach and for some, painful memories. Thanksgiving arrives to exemplify family and togetherness and Christmas looms ahead. These special days are forever reminders of our loss—the costumes we'll never sew, the empty chair at turkey dinner, the fun and magic we'll never share with someone we love; forever reminders that our child has died.

To survive when these events and anniversary days come around. let's find time to think of the good memories we have—the announcement of our long awaited pregnancy at Thanksgiving dinner, the look of excitement on our son's first Halloween night, the vision of our daughter helping prepare the turkey dinner. These holidays will always be reminders that our child died. Let us also make them reminders that our child lived! They left us memories more precious than any others to hold and celebrate!"

We are pleased to advise you that we recently found a very suitable location for our organization and were successful in negotiating the lease. The new office is located just steps away from our present location and the best news is that it is at street level, 948 Simcoe St. N, immediately south of the Shell gas station. There are plenty of parking spaces at the back of the building. The building is handicap accessible and now everyone will be able to attend meetings, drop-ins or just come in for a visit.

The inside of the premises is under renovation to our specifications, consisting of a reception area, the Executive Director office, 2 group meeting rooms, an activity space with library, a compact kitchen area and a large washroom. There is a basement, at this time for storage, but with future opportunities for additional washroom and meeting space. The move will take place towards the end of October. We have no doubt that you will love our new premises.

Over the last 4 years, we accomplished building a reserve fund. This money was necessary for the renovation and furnishing of these larger premises, and sustaining the much higher rental cost for the next few years. This was only possible due to regular and payroll donations from our members and all the hard work our member volunteers, their family and friends have contributed to our organization with their participation in fundraising events. The event was intended to help raise awareness of mental health and addiction in our community and also an opportunity to raise awareness of the support and services available at BFO-D. The money raised was divided between Bereaved Families of Ontario-Durham, and Durham Mental Health Services.

Bike Blade Board 4 Blake was held in memory of our eighteen year old son, Blake Garvey, whom we lost on February 21<sup>st</sup> 2013 to the disease of addiction. He was a fun-loving young man who enjoyed skateboarding and often had a contagious smirk on his face. He was always happy and made others happy to be around him. We know he would be proud that so many friends and family supported this event in his honour and we know he was there with us.

The walk, run, bike, blade or board event was held on September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at East Beach Park in Bowmanville. In addition to the walk/run, we had a BBQ, guest speakers, a silent auction, a raffle table and door prizes. We had some great donated prizes that many participants were determined to win. We had a great day with fantastic turnout and many comments that the event was enjoyable and generated such positive energy. It was truly a memorable event that allows us to keep Blake's memory alive.

We are grateful to the many sponsors and event participants in helping to raise funds and awareness about mental health and addiction and also support services available for those of us on this never ending journey of child loss. ## DANIELLE'S GIFT BAGS—A LITTLE SOMETHING FOR MOMS



My name is Karen Beckett and I lost my beautiful daughter, Danielle Thompson, suddenly and tragically August 24, 2014, exactly one week before her 25th birthday. In that instant my life as I knew it would never be the same. My heart shattered into a million pieces and I became a bereaved mother.

As any mom who has lost a child can tell you, a bereaved mother walks one of the hardest, most heartbreaking roads anyone will ever have to walk. It is one full of unimaginable loss and such an indescribable grief. A bereaved mother may sometimes find it difficult to take care of herself, especially in the early days when her grief is so raw. She can experience incredible anxiety, sleeplessness, and a lack of energy. This I know all too well.

Six months after I lost Danielle, I attended a "mothers' group" offered at BFO-D and it truly was a turning point for me in my grief. I made lifelong friends that are still a big support to me now and I know they always will be. There is a sisterhood among bereaved mothers and in some small way I wanted to try and help my sisters in grief.

*"Even as I rocked on my knees, howling, I detected soft breathing behind the roaring. I leaned in, listened. It was the murmuring of ten million mothers, backward and forward in time and right now, who had lost children. They were lifting me, holding me. They had woven a net of their broken hearts, and they were keeping me safe there. I realized that one day I would take my rightful place as a link in this web, and I would hold my sister-mothers when their children died. For now my only task was to grieve and be cradled in their love." ~ Excerpt from CARAVAN OF NO DESPAIR*

In Danielle's memory, I will be donating gift bags full of various comfort and self-care items to moms who are attending a "mothers' group" for the very first time. The bags will contain calming essential oil, a homemade remembrance candle, as well as ingredients for a natural rejuvenating spa bath. These items are meant to help relax, calm, and bring some comfort to a grieving mother's soul. It will also feature the book **"YOU ARE THE MOTHER OF ALL MOTHERS"**, a beautiful gift book to uplift the hearts and souls of bereaved mothers, no matter the age or cause of death, no matter the story.

I have received incredibly positive feedback from my family and friends. I had so many people generously give money towards the costs of the bags. Together we raised enough money to cover the cost of 30 gift bags with enough left over to be able to make a donation to BFO-D as well. Everyone wanted to help, not only because they love Danielle and they wanted to support me, but because they have seen what I go through on a daily basis and they also wanted to do something to help the moms who are grieving so profoundly. I am so grateful to be able to give these gifts to the moms who need them the most. As I put each bag together, I thought of my beautiful daughter and I hoped she was smiling as she dances among the butterflies.

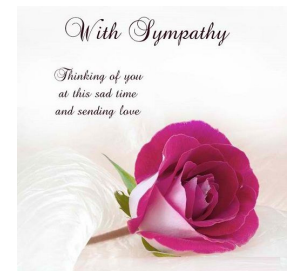

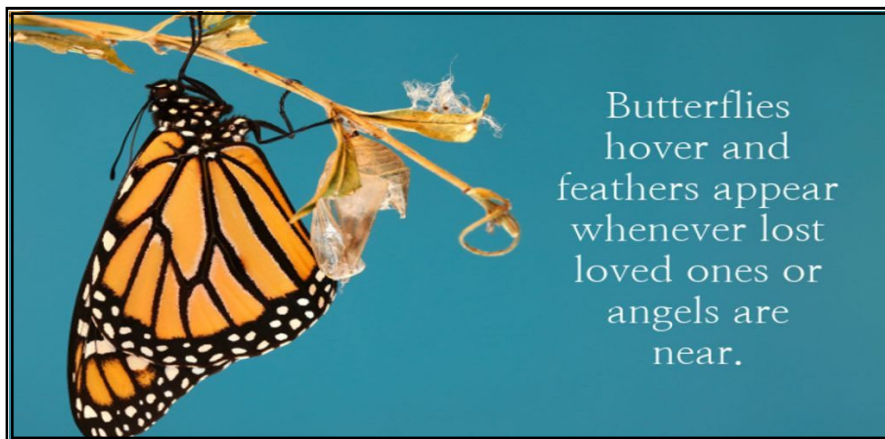

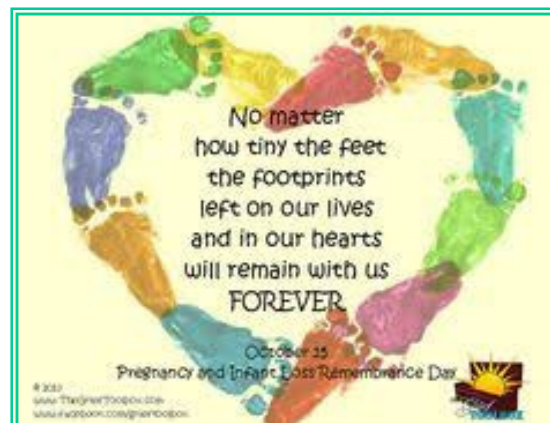
