Thank you for taking the time to honour all of our children. Well done! I am especially proud of you, because you honour the memory of your nephew through your gift of time. The content is informative and "real" and there is something for everyone, no matter the timeline of the loss. I always have a tissue ready and this newsletter didn't disappoint.

I suppose the point of this email is to let all of you know how BFO changed me as a person, as a grieving mom, as a support to others and as a mom who needs support. I hope all of you and our members feel as I do. I would do anything to have Kevin back, but that is out of my hands. Over the past three years, my responsibilities have increased at work and I've had to take a back seat on some volunteering. I made a decision to commit to a 12 week closed group with Gary and Vicky. We started the group last Wednesday and I am so happy I made this commitment. I truly feel this will be an amazing experience for all.

We all have a life outside of BFO but the fact that we still commit to volunteering and helping in any way we can is a true testament that although our children are no longer here in flesh they continue to "live" within us. What an amazing place Heaven must be.

"MELISSA'S SIXTEEN YEARS"

As milestones go, we just had one of the not so good ones. Don't get me wrong. When milestones occur they are usually cause for celebration, especially when they involve my kids. And milestones, as we know them, come as many different events. We have birthdays, anniversaries, first day of school, graduation, many other events and for those who are of my generation, even the retirement milestone.

However, the milestone that has recently occurred for my family and for me is much different than those listed above.

My daughter Melissa died March 5, 1998 at the age of 16. Her anniversary March 5, 2014 was even more significant than past anniversaries in that we are now in the part of our journey where Melissa has been gone longer than she lived.

It's kind of weird knowing that. We have now been without her for longer than we had her. And getting back to milestones, I'm not sure how I'm supposed to feel about that. We always recognize her "Angel Day". Nancy and I watch Titanic, and recite all the lines before they are spoken. I try to take the day off work or maybe work from home. We talk to family and friends while reminiscing about time gone by. These events are now our traditions and they will certainly continue.

Maybe this milestone anniversary is no different than all the others, except in my head. Looking back over 16 years, they go by fast. And maybe the only problem I have is that her 16th anniversary got here too fast. I mean, it's here already! I guess the significance is personal to those who experience the "time here, time gone" realization.

In any case, the journey continues for all of us. We just have to deal with dates, events, milestones, etc. the best way we can. We connect with family and friends. We also connect with our BFO Durham friends who all simply just "get it".

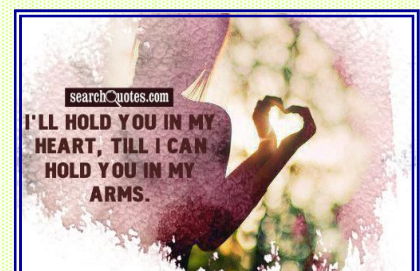
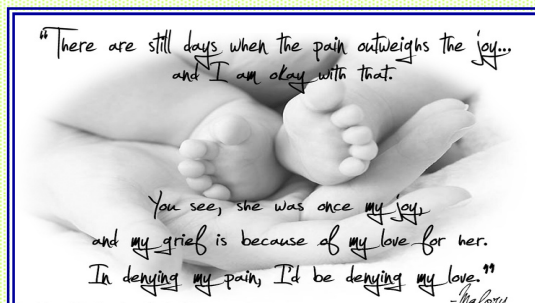
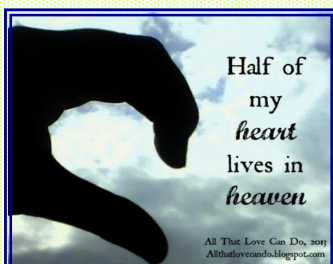
I also think that as time has gone by, I've had to come to the realization that part of my journey was subconsciously dedicated to finding acceptance rather than searching for understanding. This has been hard to do.

Maybe we all have the same challenge when it comes to acceptance versus understanding. I don't know. But the passage of time, in my case 16 years, is probably relevant. I have indeed recognized that understanding of why she died is out of my reach and at the same time, acceptance is not an option but rather has to be, for me, simply the only way to proceed as my journey continues into the next 16 years.

It is tremendously difficult coming to grips with the loss of your child. The journey afterward is day by day. The adage, same junk, different day, is so appropriate. But then in what seems to be a blink, 16 years has gone by. And here we are, different people compared to who we would have been. It is all so surreal; no understanding, just acceptance of a history that includes the loss of a child.

So maybe my Melissa dying at age 16 and now gone for 16 years just gives me cause to dwell more thoroughly on what I've been dwelling on all this time. And that is how much I loved my daughter and how much I miss her.

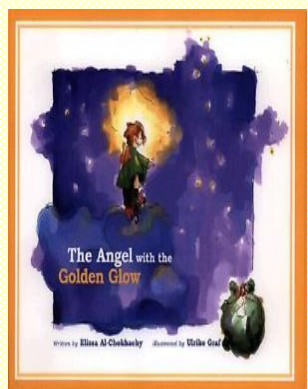


BOOKS IN REVIEW — "HOW TO HELP A CHILD GRIEVE"



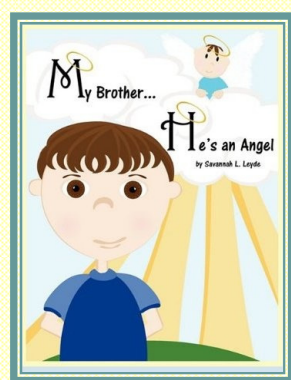
That summer the brothers ran into the sun, freed from school. Time for fishing poles, lightning bugs, country roads, baseball gloves. But then Joey was dying. What do you do when someone you love is leaving the world? You reach for fragments of memory, like moments caught on film. You savour the vivid colors and small joys of each new day. That's what Joey's family does when they know he is leaving them.

Tony Johnston's poignant words and Barry Moser's intimate pictures, a blend of past and present, invite us to share the experience of that summer - a season of family, of life, and of love.



This title teaches the importance of living every moment of life, and that love and life are eternal. Families dealing with a special-needs child, or the loss of a child will find *The Angel with the Golden Glow* to be a resource of comfort with its underlying principle that our spirits live forever.

This book's content will evoke emotions and discussion, and help instill the basic premise that "everyone has a purpose".



After experiencing the unexpected loss of his baby brother, with the help of his family, a little boy begins a journey of understanding and healing. It is written in reflection of a child's grief, in hopes of allowing children the opportunity to explore the many ways to express their feelings, which will ultimately give them the opportunity to begin the healing process.

It also serves as a tool for parents and families, to keep communication open regarding loss and the confusion it often times brings.
