The ANGELS' TREE OF LIGHT 2020

On Thursday, November 26thnd BFO Durham Region held its annual Angels' Tree of Light ceremony, though not in quite the same way as the previous years. This year marked the 25th anniversary of the Angel Tree ceremony and what a year it has been! The committee realised early on, that a live ceremony at the Durham District School Board was unlikely due to Covid 19 restrictions. It was disheartening, as this was a special anniversary but BFO-Durham was not about to give up! The committee started planning for a film of the ceremony including a little bit of history of how it all started. This idea grew into the video, "BFO Durham Angels' Tree of Light Silver Ceremony; commemorating 25 years of love"

This year, the angel selected was a delicate silver filigree and each angel had the name of a loved one handwritten on silver ribbon. The tree looked beautiful as always, with each angel representing a loved one sadly missed by their families and friends throughout the year but especially during the holiday season.

Jane Carter (Executive Director, BFO Durham) welcomed everyone to the ceremony with soothing words as this can be a difficult time, especially for those experiencing a loss for the first time.

BFO-Durham was pleased to welcome back Rev. Maureen McLellan to deliver the Opening Remarks. Her gentle words gave advice, encouragement and support to the audience. She spoke with empathy and understanding, noting the difficulties of grieving when we are physically distanced from those who would normally be present to support us.

This year, the tree was dedicated by Bev Campbell and Marnie Cowen in memory of their son and brother, Michael Campbell. Bev spoke from her heart about her grief journey following the loss of her son, Michael. She spoke of her first Christmas without Michael feeling like she was in a "black hole" that she could not escape from. She was thankful to BFO-Durham for leading her out of that "black hole". Marnie spoke about losing Michael from a different perspective, that of a sibling. She spoke eloquently of the strong bond she had with her brother and her loss was not just of a brother but of a true friend. She was also thankful to BFO-Durham for helping her Mom, when she could not.

Andrea and Michael Provenzano along with their children, Gia and Melania had the honour of lighting our tree this year, in memory of their sister/aunt Paulina and nonno Gaspere. After the tree was lit, there was a moment of silence for reflection, followed by a musical tribute to all the "angels".

ANGELS TREE OF LIGHT DEDICATION 2020

November 26, 2020

Good evening everyone, my name is Bev Campbell & I would like to welcome you all to Bereaved Families 25th Anniversary Angels' Tree of Light.

This year we had to do things a little different due to Covid 19. We are in a new location and sadly without a live audience. This year, I have a few different Angel names on the tree. This magnificent tree represents all our loved ones who have now passed on. But the Angel I would like to talk to you about is my son, Michael.

Michael passed away 11 years ago at the age of 39 but it still seems like yesterday. He died of a rare form of leukemia. In a matter of 3 days & 4 different hospitals, he was gone. No warnings, no last "I love you s". Just gone.

Michael was such an inspiration to us all. His kindness & generosity to others was remarkable. He was always the first one there if you needed help. He had this infectious laugh that came from the bottom of his soul & it made you laugh too. It just made you feel so good. And how he loved to read. He always had a book in his hand. Music was his second passion. He started his own magazine called "The Sepulchral Voice" that promoted many Metal Bands in the Durham Region & was read around the world. These are just a few of his many talents.

Michael also left behind his wife, Donna & his 16-year-old son, Michael Jr who still has a hard time dealing with the death of his father.

Michael loved Christmas; it was his favourite holiday. He loved everything about it; family & friends gathering together, the hustle & bustle & especially the Christmas cheer. That first Christmas without him with us, I felt like I was in a black hole & I couldn't get out. It was as if someone had ripped the heart out of my body. I'm sure many of you can relate to this. I sure wasn't up for any celebrations. I wasn't thinking or really caring about anyone else in the family. I know Michael would not have wanted that. He would have wanted us to carry on with his favourite holiday; but I just couldn't. I spoiled that holiday for everyone; something I regret to this day.

I searched everywhere to find someone to help me, but I couldn't find anyone who really understood the loss of a child. Then I found Bereaved Families & that is when I really started to heal. I was with people who were going through the same heartache. They never tired of my story. They helped me. They get it. I've come to realize that nothing in this life can prepare us for losing someone we love.

I still remain at BFO Durham after 10 years. I wanted to help others as they helped me. I am an office volunteer, trained facilitator & proud member of the Board of Directors. My grand-daughter, Lily, asked me one day, "Nanny, how long will you be going to BFO?" I said, "Lily, till the day I die". Thank you, BFO. You literally saved my life.

Hello everyone, I'm Marnie, Bev's daughter & little sister to the Angel my Mom just spoke so beautifully about, Michael.

As my Mom mentioned, my brother died of a very rare form of leukemia & within 3 days of his diagnosis, he was gone. His passing was so sudden & unexpected, it truly was a pain I cannot describe & it was a loss I have never experienced before. Even speaking about it now, it feels like it just happened yesterday & not 11 years ago.

Michael & I didn't have your typical brother/sister relationship; to this day I still can't think of a time when we didn't get along. He was 5 years older than me but he took me everywhere with him, even without my parents asking him to. He would always let me tag along. I was a very proud little sister. As we got older, our relationship & the bond we had grew also. We became the best of friends into adulthood.

Although I have countless memories of us growing up together, some of the most memorable ones were during the Christmas season. Michael & I loved Christmas; it was the holiday we both looked forward to every year. When we were kids, as Christmas was fast approaching, we would play "Hide & Seek", just to have an excuse to find the most secretive spots in hopes to catch a glimpse of some hidden gems that would eventually make their way under the tree. And as we got older, it wasn't about playing hide & seek in the hopes of finding gifts, it became more about time, time spent together laughing & celebrating. Although all of the customs & traditions that we built have carried on, Christmas just isn't the same without my brother's laugh.

Michael was a beautiful soul. He was kind, giving, loyal, compassionate, authentic, funny, reliable, ambitious, considerate, brave & courageous, especially throughout the last few days of his life & I miss him every day. I would like to thank BFO for allowing me this time to brag about my big brother, Michael. I would also like to thank BFO & everyone involved for all of the love & support you have provided for my Mom. You have all helped her in ways I never could, no matter how hard I tried. Years later my Mom now helps those in need of the exact same love & support & I could not be more proud of her.

My Mom & I feel honoured to dedicate this special 25th Angels' Tree of Light, in loving memory of all our children, siblings, parents, grandparents, partners, family & friends.

We want to wish everyone a peaceful & healthy holiday season & as difficult as this time of year can be, remember our Angels will be in our hearts & minds forever.

WALK TO REMEMBER MARCH 7TH 2021

As with many aspects of life these days, we have had to adapt our annual Walk to Remember to comply with provincial Covid-19 restrictions. This year we are suggesting participants walk in their own small group at an outside location of their choice. You have the option of making a short video of your walk to submit to BFO Durham (see instructions below). We will still have the banners with your child's photo and messages and also their will be a virtual banner posted on our website.

Collection of pledges can be done in person using the pledge forms and if you are on Facebook you can create your own Facebook donation page for the Walk to Remember

"How to submit your individual/small group walk video

Take a video of yourself walking and say your name and who you are walking in memory of. You may also want to say what town you are walking in just for variety.

- Please keep your video under 2GB in size (under 2 minutes) then you can send your video via We Transfer (https://wetransfer.com/) this is a free website that does not require log in. All you need to do is enter the receiving email address (bfodurham@bellnet.ca) and in the message include your name, add your video file and hit transfer
- Please record your video in LANDSCAPE mode to keep all video submissions consistent (If unsure what landscape mode is,



- Best practice when recording a video- have someone else take the video, make sure you are close enough to the camera/phone to ensure the audio is clear
- Try to avoid any major light sources behind you as this may cast a shadow on your face
- Avoid a lot of motion when recording if possible

Adult (18+) Sibling Loss

Hello Everyone,

I wanted to take the time to introduce myself to you all and reach out to all other siblings who may be looking for support and guidance. I am one of the facilitators for the adult sibling loss (18+) drop-ins.

Throughout my grief journey, the biggest issue I noticed was to try and find a connection and network with other surviving siblings who would know exactly how I felt after losing my youngest sister. I didn't like the feeling of being alone and not having someone I could reach out to and talk about different topics of grief with a sibling loss. When I first found BFO, there was a drop-in group for sibling loss, however, it would be a few months apart, but to me, it didn't matter because it still gave me a chance to hopefully meet others and be able to chat for that 2-hours, about anything that was bothering me at the time. Topics such as; birthdays, anniversaries, my story, my relationship with other family members, where I saw my future going, etc. These were the reasons why I knew when I felt ready, I wanted to give back to BFO and support other adult siblings and become a facilitator to provide my experience in grief and what strategies and tactics I've used to overcome difficulties.

We (BFO-Durham) are offering a <u>regular monthly zoom drop-in style meeting (2nd Tuesday of each month 7pm-9pm).</u>
As a facilitator, I am always available to do one-on-one sessions as well for those who may want to start with something more intimate. I hope that during these times, you stay healthy and safe and know that here at BFO, we are a family, and you are not alone.

'Danielle's gift bags'



My name is Karen Beckett and I lost my beautiful daughter, Danielle, suddenly and tragically August 24, 2014, exactly one week before her 25th birthday. In that instant my life as I knew it would never be the same. My heart shattered into a million pieces and I became a bereaved mother.

As any mom who has lost a child can tell you, a bereaved mother walks one of the hardest, most heartbreaking roads anyone will ever have to walk. It is one full of unimaginable loss and such an indescribable grief. A bereaved mother may sometimes find it difficult to take care of herself, especially in the early days when her grief is so raw. She can experience incredible anxiety, sleeplessness, and a lack of energy. This I know all too well.

Six months after I lost Danielle, I attended a "mothers' group" offered at BFO and it truly was a turning point for me in my grief. I made lifelong friends that are still a big support to me now and I know they always will be. There is a sisterhood among bereaved mothers and in some small way I wanted to try and help my sisters in grief.

"Even as I rocked on my knees, howling I detected soft breathing behind the roaring. I leaned in, listened. It was the murmuring of ten million mothers, backward and forward in time and right now, who had lost children. They were lifting me, holding me. They had woven a net of their broken hearts, and they were keeping me safe there. I realized that one day I would take my rightful place as a link in this web, and I would hold my sister-mothers when their children died. For now my only task was to grieve and be cradled in their love."



I will also include some lavender oil for the relaxing benefits from this essential oil.

I have donated over a hundred bags to mamas over the last few years. I have received incredibly positive feedback from my family and friends. I had so many people generously give money towards the costs of the bags. Everyone wanted to help, not only because they love Danielle and they wanted to support me, but because they have seen what I go through on a daily basis and they also wanted to do something to help the moms who are grieving so profoundly. I am so grateful to be able to give these gifts to the moms who need them the most. As I put each bag together, I think of my beautiful daughter and I hoped she is smiling as she dances among the butterflies.
