On Thursday, November 25thnd BFO Durham Region held its annual Angels' Tree of Light ceremony. Covid 19 restrictions again derailed our plans to hold an in-person ceremony at the Durham District School Board headquarters. We were very fortunate to have Anthony Moreino step up and offer his studio and videography expertise to record this year's ceremony.

This year, the angel selected was hand-crafted by one of our members, Leigh Hutchison in memory of her son, Nicholas. Burlap angels with white lace and pearl accents adorned our tree. Each angel had the name of a loved one handwritten on white ribbon. Following the suggestion of one of our committee members, we decided to include a tribute to the Indigenous children lost to the residential school system, by placing orange bows amongst the angels on the tree. The tree looked beautiful as always, with each angel representing a loved one sadly missed by their families and friends throughout the year but especially during the holiday season.

Jane Carter (Executive Director, BFO Durham) welcomed everyone to the ceremony with soothing words as this can be a difficult time, especially for those experiencing a loss for the first time.

BFO-Durham was pleased to welcome back Rev. Maureen McLellan to deliver the Opening Remarks. Her gentle words gave advice, encouragement and support to the audience. She spoke with empathy and understanding, noting the difficulties of grieving when we are physically distanced from those who would normally be present to support us.

Joyce MacIntyre joined us this year to give the Orange Ribbon Tribute. She composed and recited a special prayer to honour and remember the Indigenous children lost to residential schools. Joyce's meaningful words were followed by our first song of the evening.

Jonathan Onley performed "Even Though I'm Gone "in memory of his children, Sarah, and Asa.

The dedication of the tree was given by Mike Kelly in memory of his son, Andrew. He spoke from his heart about how difficult that first year is, having to negotiate all those "firsts" without your loved one. Mike talked about taking comfort from signs that show his connection to Andrew and spoke about connections that link us all together. January 2022

Dear Friends:

I hope this note finds you safe and well as we head into 2022. Last year certainly brought many challenges for all of us, but I'm confident that the Covid miseries of the past two years are now behind us. Our organization had a number of fundraisers cancelled, but thankfully we were able to continue some of these on line, just like the Angel Tree of Lights and the Walk to Remember. Many of our members have also chosen monthly donations. If you would like to also contribute monthly as well, please call the office. There were several companies that chose BFO-Durham Region as their charity of choice and we are enormously grateful.

ANGELS TREE OF LIGHT DEDICATION 2021

November 25, 2021

Hi and welcome to the Angel Tree Ceremony for 2021. My name is Mike and I too have an Angel on the tree. We lost our youngest son Andrew to suicide in March of 2019. He was one month shy of his 30th birthday.

What followed for us, as most of you have gone through, was a year of firsts. It was lucky for us in a way that his birthday happened so soon after he had passed. We were still in the fog of grief and didn't really have to acknowledge it.

Our first Angel Tree Ceremony was in November of that year and for those of you who were there you know how well attended it was. It's a comforting feeling in that room when you realize that you are not going through this by yourself. We are doing this virtually this year because of COVID 19 and for those of you who are new to the ceremony please know that you are not alone.

We all have different beliefs and ways of staying connected with our lost loved ones. Andrew is never out of my thoughts but whenever I find a dime or see a cardinal in the backyard it brings thoughts of Andrew to the top of my mind. Those kinds of things really help me to feel a connection.

Feeling a connection is really what the Angel Tree Ceremony is all about. As you go through this event thoughts of your loved one will naturally go to the top of your mind.

I dedicate the Angel tree to all of you who have lost loved ones. The holiday season can be especially hard as you notice more acutely the empty chair in the room. I hope the Angel you have on the tree lets you feel a connection and find some comfort.

Where to begin...after the death of our oldest son, we struggled and still do, but our focus has remained on the two amazing siblings that he left behind. From the moment our family walked through the doors of BFO we felt welcomed and privileged to be a part of the sibling group - the facilitators showed compassion and empathy in an unexplainable way! 17 months after our son's death, I feel that we are on the right path of learning how to live without our son/their brother – physically. Our daughter has made enormous gains from attending sibling night and has created many connections and hopefully some lifelong friendships. Being a part of group of people "who get you" or "know how you are feeling" truly does help with grief processing. Our daughter has truly enjoyed every week, the different crafts created to commemorative the passing of loved ones. Although our youngest is still too young, we know that we will back to help him through his grief journey as well. Our daughter absolutely adored her older brother and looked up to him each and every day and now he is no longer physically here and all she has is those memories - thank you from the bottom of our hearts for allowing our family to enter through your doors, it has truly been life changing for each one of us! and remember – There is a HERO in all of us

WALK TO REMEMBER MARCH 6TH 2022

As with many aspects of life these days, we have had to adapt our annual Walk to Remember to comply with provincial Covid-19 restrictions. This year we are suggesting participants walk in their own small group at an outside location of their choice. You have the option of making a short video of your walk to submit to BFO Durham (see instructions below). We will still have the banners with your child's photo and messages and also there will be a virtual banner posted on our website.

Collection of pledges can be done in person using the pledge forms and if you are on Facebook you can create your own Facebook donation page for the Walk to Remember

"How to submit your individual/small group walk video

Take a video of yourself walking and say your name and who you are walking in memory of. You may also want to say what town you are walking in just for variety. For clear sound, please try not to record on a windy day.

Please keep your video under 2GB in size (under 2 minutes) then you can send your video via We Transfer
 (<u>https://wetransfer.com/</u>) this is a free website that does not require log in. All you need to do is enter the receiving email address (<u>anthonym@questaudiovisual.com</u>) and in the message include your name, add your video file and hit transfer

- Please record your video in LANDSCAPE mode to keep all video submissions consistent (If unsure what landscape mode is,



- Best practice when recording a video- have someone else take the video, make sure you are close enough to the camera/phone to ensure the audio is clear

- Try to avoid any major light sources behind you as this may cast a shadow on your face
- Avoid a lot of motion when recording if possible
-and that's it!

We will be publishing the video early March 2022

Walk To Remember Banners

Registration

All "Walk to Remember" participants must read, complete and sign the registration form. A parent or guardian must sign the registration on behalf of walkers under the age of 18 years.

Before the Walk

Obtain pledges from sponsors of your choosing (i.e. family, friends, neighbours, teachers, etc.) Collect each pledge at the time you recruit the sponsor. Be sure to tell your sponsor that an official tax receipt will be given for pledges of \$25 or more.

Create your Facebook Charity Fundraiser for BFO Durham and send the link to all your friends & family. Remember to "Share" your fundraiser to help keep it in mind.

Cheques should be made payable to: Bereaved Families of Ontario – Durham Region.

E-Transfers should be sent to <u>BFODurham@bellnet.ca</u>, please put a note of the name of the person "remembered" and that the money is for the Walk to Remember – this helps us recognise who to assign the money collected to.

'Danielle's gift bags'



My name is Karen Beckett and I lost my beautiful daughter, Danielle, suddenly and tragically August 24, 2014, exactly one week before her 25th birthday. In that instant my life as I knew it would never be the same. My heart shattered into a million pieces and I became a bereaved mother.

As any mom who has lost a child can tell you, a bereaved mother walks one of the hardest, most heartbreaking roads anyone will ever have to walk. It is one full of unimaginable loss and such an indescribable grief. A bereaved mother may sometimes find it difficult to take care of herself, especially in the early days when her grief is so raw. She can experience incredible anxiety, sleeplessness, and a lack of energy. This I know all too well.

Six months after I lost Danielle, I attended a "mothers' group" offered at BFO and it truly was a turning point for me in my grief. I made lifelong friends that are still a big support to me now and I know they always will be. There is a sisterhood among bereaved mothers and in some small way I wanted to try and help my sisters in grief.

"Even as I rocked on my knees, howling I detected soft breathing behind the roaring. I leaned in, listened. It was the murmuring of ten million mothers, backward and forward in time and right now, who had lost children. They were lifting me, holding me. They had woven a net of their broken hearts, and they were keeping me safe there. I realized that one day I would take my rightful place as a link in this web, and I would hold my sister-mothers when their children died. For now my only task was to grieve and be cradled in their love." -Excerpt from CARAVAN OF NO DESPAIR

In Danielle's memory, I will be donating gift bags full of various comfort and self-care items to moms who are attending a "mothers' group" for the very first time. The bags will feature the book *You Are The Mother Of All Mothers*, a beautiful gift book to uplift the hearts and souls of bereaved mothers, no matter the age or cause of death, no matter the story. This year I am happy to announce I will be collaborating with a fellow bereaved mama and owner of Spirit Wear Jewelry, a lovely shop on Etsy, who will make beautiful hand crafted bracelets. They will be designed with chakra beads to help bring balance and grounding as well as essential oil diffusing beads. I will also include some lavender oil for the relaxing benefits from this essential oil.

I have donated over a hundred bags to mamas over the last few years. I have received incredibly positive feedback from my family and friends. I had so many people generously give money towards the costs of the bags. Everyone wanted to help, not only because they love Danielle and they wanted to support me, but because they have seen what I go through on a daily basis and they also wanted to do something to help the moms who are grieving so profoundly. I am so grateful to be able to give these gifts to the moms who need them the most. As I put each bag together, I think of my beautiful daughter and I hoped she is smiling as she dances among the butterflies.
